Some of the other saints we celebrate this July are: Our Lady of Mount Carmel, St. Mary Magdalene, St. Bridget, Sts. Martha, Mary and Lazarus.

St. Mary Magdalene, healed of seven demons by our Lord was His faithful follower, right to the end where she stood with Mary at the foot of the cross. After the Ascension, when the disciples left the Holy Land, Mary settled for a life of seclusion in a cave in Baum, France. St. Mary Magdalene, pray for us.

Sts. Martha, Mary and Lazarus were close friends to Jesus, and it is believed that Jesus visited them many times during His travels to rest and revitalize Himself. Martha was the busy one, Jesus said: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious about so many things, but Mary chooses the better part for herself." (Luke 10:41-42.) Here Martha wants Mary to help her serve Jesus and his disciples, while Mary chooses to sit at the feet of Jesus and enjoy His presence. The Lord seems to be saying, the spiritual is much more important than the physical/material.
